Final examination in the European Master in Lexicography programme

Objective: In the final examination, EMLex graduates demonstrate their expertise in the field of lexicography and dictionary research in a complex examination before an examination board.

Examination board: It consists of at least three persons, the supervisors and/or reviewers of the Master's thesis and one external member. At least two members must come from the EMLex consortium.

Final examination: It consists of two parts, the defence of the Master's thesis and an examination in three subject areas. The languages of the examination are German and English. The defence must be in the language in which the Master's thesis was written.

The *defence* takes place with the help of a 15-minute ppt presentation in which the objective and the results of the thesis are presented. In the defence, the candidate must also respond to the criticisms of the expert reports.

The three subject areas of the examination are as follows:

- Linguistic Foundations for Lexicography (B1).

- Metalexicography (A1) or Research into Dictionary Use (A4) or the module relevant to the Master's thesis (in agreement with the supervisor)

- Dictionary Planning and Production (P)

The first topic complexes are examined in German and/or English for a maximum of 10 minutes each. The last topic complex includes a short, approximately 10-minute presentation of the practical work in the context of the internship(s).

Overall grade: Accordingly, there are four sub-grades, one for the Master's thesis with defence and one in each of the three topic complexes. The overall grade is calculated according to the TVSZ (examination regulations) of the KRE, 83§ (5). The description of the final examination is in accordance with the provisions of the TVSZ (80§-83§).

The TVSZ of KRE is relevant for the questions not separately regulated in this document.
