Course Description:

The course provides an introduction to the music theory of European composed music from the very early Renaissance till Early Romanticism.

Course objectives:

Students will learn the

- importance of music theory in European music literacy;
- the importance of the different music features in music materials;
- learn about background sciences.

Students will be able to

- realize music analyses in different music;
- realise an understanding of the different music situation, based on music theory;
- demonstrate experiences in their music making practice.

Course content:

- Music-theoretical knowledge
- Analysis of compositions from different music historical periods
- the types of the triads; first and second inversion; the features of homophonic and polyphonic music; the main functions; the types of the cadences; modal and authentic relations between chords; tempus perfectum; modal crossing; motive, phrase, types of the period; cephalicus, hemiola; passing and changing notes; 4-3 suspension; seventh chord(s) and their inversions; the most important altered chords; modulation to different keynotes; chord progressions basic rules.

Professional competences:

Knowledge: Students in the course

- learn the essence of music theory, the special skills and competences required for teachers' musical activities, as well as their experiential music education;
- learn the musical, psychological and pedagogical aspects and contexts that can be used in their later music education work;
- are familiar with the process of personalization of music of a certain age group according to their educational programme;

Ability: Students

- acquire the skills necessary for the development of authentic performance and music education in order to develop children's age-related, relevant musical skills and abilities;
- possess the knowledge and music skills acquired during the course, with advanced knowledge, will be able to project age-appropriate music pedagogical activities in a given work environment and to give children experience;
- will be able to acquire new musical and pedagogical competences needed for their later music education work.
