Course Description:

The seminar focuses on the international production history of Samuel Beckett's plays through drama and performance analysis. Students are also introduced to Beckett's work as a stage director, his unique method of instructing actors, his management of time and space, and ceaseless struggle for symmetry and silence. From 1966, Beckett directed several of his own plays in Berlin, London and Paris. The seminar offers the possibility of watching a number of these rare recordings in part or whole. Regular attendance, active participation and reading the assigned plays prior to classes are prerequisites for the completion of the course. Maximum three absences are allowed.
