Brief description

The course starts with an epistemological foundation of psychology. It is followed by an introduction to existential and humanistic psychology, including the encounter movement of the 60s and 70s. Then the psychedelic movement of the 60s and the significance of altered states of consciousness in psychological and philosophical research will be discussed. The second half of the course starts with an outline of Descartes' ideas about the human mind and the Cartesian scientific method. Then the lectures will discuss the first decades of the experimental psychology and the critiques of the experimental psychology after the WWI. The last part of the course will be about the Freudian psychoanalysis and the Husserlian phenomenology.
