<p>Course description: The course aims at exploring the different aspects of intercultural communication. We will examine the evolution and importance of communication and how cross-cultural understanding has gained significance. The course will introduce the theoretical framework of intercultural communication but it will also highlight the practical issues affecting everyday communication situations. There will be a special focus on the cultural differences affecting verbal and nonverbal communication. The course will offer practical solutions on how to function in multicultural workplaces and professional situations when recognizing and understanding cultural differences can play key roles in preventing conflicts. Course requirements: students will be required to choose a text from the coursebook as well as supplementary materials to prepare a 20-minute-long presentation, which will be followed by questions and a discussion. Active in-class participation is also mandatory. (Further specifications and requirements regarding the presentation will be provided at the beginning of the course via Neptun and Moodle.
