Course Description:

The course aims at improving students' general English language proficiency in terms of accuracy of grammar, range of vocabulary, reading comprehension and speaking. These skills are developed in preparation for the Basic Exam. Language development is based on Modules 6-10 of the Pioneer course book.

Assessment is based on:

- 5 in-class tests, one for each Module; each test consists of grammar, vocabulary and reading tasks: 25 points each = 125 points (90%)
- active in-class participation: includes preparation and doing homework for each class as well as frequent contributions to discussions: 15 points (10%)

Grading scale: 0%-59%: 1; 60%-69%: 2; 70%-75%: 3; 76%-85%: 4; 86%-100%: 5. (100% = 140p) 0-83p: 1; 84-97p: 2; 98p-105p: 3; 106-119p: 4; 120-140p: 5.

Preparation for each class (doing the exercises assigned as homework from the course book; reading the Grammar Reference sections; revising vocabulary; doing practice exercises from the workbook) and bringing the course book to class are essential for the successful completion of this course.

In case you are absent on a test-taking day, you can take 1 make-up test in the last week of the course. Attendance is compulsory: a maximum of 5 (five!) absences are allowed, including absences due to illness.
