Course Description:			
<p>This course explores 20th and 21st century Irish literature and culture. Special emphasis will be placed on high modernist poetry and fiction, dramatic experiments as well as the cultural and historical context in which these works emerged. Literary works to be studied include, but are not limited to, the writings of W.B. Yeats, James Joyce, the poems of Seamus Heaney, the dramas of Brian Friel and Martin McDonagh, the novels of Iris Murdoch and John Banville, the films of Martin McDonagh and John Michael McDonagh, as well as adaptations and films that explore the life and works of Irish authors, such as <i>Iris</i> (dir. Richard Eyre). Apart from mapping the cultural and historical contexts of literary works and films, classes will also address issues concerning cultural identity, migration, race, language, gender, and postcolonial readings of Irish literature.</p>
