Course Description:

This course is aimed for students who have accomplished the first semester's Hungarian course (or are at the same level of Hungarian language). By the end of the Hungarian for "post-beginners" course, students will be able to communicate in Hungarian more fluently than before and besides revising and practising some of what they have already learned, new topics are also expected to emerge, e.g. free-time activities, shopping, times and places of activities, expression of personal priorities (topics depend on the starting level of the students).

The course also serves students' needs for learning Hungarian by providing a brief question-and-answer session at the beginning of each class where questions brought by students can be discussed (words and phrases that might need instant translation and clarification for any reason).

The aim of the cultural part of the course is that students experience Hungarian culture in different ways and they reflect on their experiences. Various features of Hungarian culture are going to be discussed in class. The discussions include interactive and group activities that develop students' cultural competence.
