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**Course Description:**

The aim of this course is to introduce the terminology and basics of British Received Pronunciation (segmental inventory, processes, letter-to-sound regularities), to provide practice in analysing data and in reading and doing phonemic transcription using the Gimsonian IPA. Assessment is based on two in-class tests and active participation. Students are allowed three absences during the term.
