Course Description:

The aim of this course is to introduce students to the main events of British history in the 19th and 20th centuries with a special emphasis on Britain's colonial empire and its disintegration, on the ideas of parliamentary democracy and on the post-World War issues of building a welfare state. Besides providing a chronological outline of the events, the course wishes to emphasize the connections and broad trends within history, the parallel developments within European and Hungarian history in order to enable students to place particular events within a meaningful context. Besides the chapters of the required textbooks, and a collection of primary sources, a number of films connected to the different topics will be discussed in class.
