Course description: The course aims to present an overview of Augustine as both an outstanding figure of his time and a thinker whose ideas have had a significant impact on the history of medieval and modern philosophy. His work has also helped to formulate responses to contemporary issues. We will also examine how the founding figures of Protestantism were indebted to Augustine's works on the doctrine of grace. Students will read short excerpts from the sources listed below each week, which we will then discuss together.			
Topics to be examined: (This agenda is just a suggestion; some topics may take priority in accordance with the students' interests). 1. Antecedents in ancient pagan philosophy: Neoplatonism, Stoicism and scepticism. 2. Christian Precursors: The great apologists (Irenaeus, Origen, Tertullian, Ambrosiaster and Pelagius). 3. Augustine's career as a rhetorician, teacher, pastor and church leader. 4. What does one do when believing in Christ? Belief and faith; faith and reason. 5. Are we free or determined to do wrong or right? Free will and grace. 6. Who am I? The question of the self. 7. The love of God and the love of one's brethren. The theory of spiritual communism. 8. Is there such a thing as a Christian state? The Two Cities 9. Is it permissible to force someone to return to the true faith? 10. Can or should we lie in certain cases? 11. Is sex sinful?			
Requirements: Students are expected to: a) attend at least 9 out of 12 classes; b) read the compulsory texts.
