

Rules on the use of immunity certificates pursuant to Government Decree 484/2020 (10 November)

1. A person protected against the coronavirus is a person who can prove this by presenting an official certificate (hereinafter: immunity certificate) according to Government Decree 60/2021 (12 February) on certifying immunity to coronavirus (hereinafter referred to as “Immunity Certificate”).
2. If a right under the Government Decree can be exercised in the case of immunity to the coronavirus, the person intending to exercise this right may be requested to present his/her immunity certificate in order to prove his/her immunity.
3. It is equivalent to presenting the immunity certificate if the person concerned proves his/her immunity to the coronavirus by an app certifying vaccination against coronavirus in accordance with Government Decree 60/2021 (12 February) on certifying immunity to coronavirus.
4. When proving immunity to the coronavirus, the person concerned may also be requested to present an official document verifying the identity indicated on the immunity certificate.
5. It is also equivalent to the presentation of the immunity certificate if a non-Hungarian citizen or a Hungarian citizen without an address in Hungary proves his/her immunity by presenting an EU Digital COVID Certificate (DCC) in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2021/953 of the European Parliament and the Council of 14 June 2021 on a framework for the issuance, verification and acceptance of interoperable COVID-19 vaccination, test and recovery certificates (EU Digital COVID Certificate) to facilitate free movement during the COVID-19 pandemic.
6. In addition, a person is protected against the coronavirus for the purposes of the Government Decree if he/she holds an immunity certificate issued by a state whose immunity certificate is recognised by Hungary, and this fact has been established by the Minister responsible for Foreign Affairs in a decree issued in agreement with the Minister responsible for Border Police, and the person concerned can prove his/her immunity to the coronavirus by presenting the immunity certificate issued for him/her.
7. When proving immunity to the coronavirus – in the cases specified in points 5. and 6. –, the person concerned may also be requested to present an official identity document or travel document suitable for verifying identity.
